COMMUNITY SERVICES

The Community Services Committee met on June 5th to organize our fall programs, especially our Back To School Supply Program, which we will be collecting items during August. We will begin collecting "back to school items" August 4th and the last day to bring them into the church so that they can be dispersed to Title 1 schools in the area will be August 25th. School will begin after Labor Day, and we will be delivering the supplies the week before the schools open to the students. These supplies are given to students whose families struggle to afford what is needed for them to complete their school work, so that the support that we can give them is important to their being able to learn successfully. We will have a list of supplies needed in the church bulletin in July.

This time of year, our feeding program grows significantly as we welcome the students who come from countries around the world to work during the summer months. On the day that we met, we had 150 people at the feeding program and this promises to continue until the students return to their homes sometime in August and September. The students are very grateful for this support and the opportunity to get to know people from our area. Our volunteers not only offer them a nutritional meal and some additional groceries, but are often times helpful to them by providing information and a helping hand in other ways. With this increase in the number of people we are feeding weekly, we would appreciate you bringing in groceries to replenish our pantry or to provide ongoing financial support to this program so that we will have enough food supplies to cover the need over the summer months. Canned goods of vegetables and fruit, peanut butter, jelly, soup, canned tuna are all food items that are needed. It is greatly appreciated if, while doing your shopping, you can pick up a few of these items and bring them in for the pantry. Of course, your financial support allows us to purchase more through the food bank and other sources. These gifts are vital to our feeding program--thank you.

Again, we will have items for Back to School listed in the bulletin a few weeks before collection starts, so please be aware of that, and we will list them, again, in next month's NET article. Our next meeting of the committee will take place the second Wednesday of September which is the 11th at 2PM at the church.

Our committee also discussed the upcoming Peach Festival which will take place in August, and our plans to volunteer for that event, which has always been a way to bring people together from our congregation and the community as well as some much needed financial support for St Peter's. We all plan to be there and hope to see all of you there also!!

Life at St. Peter's

Our worship schedule offers a Contemporary Worship Service at 9:00 a.m. and a Traditional Worship Service at 10:30 a.m. each Sunday. We are offering Holy Communion at both services, handing you the bread and pouring red wine into your cup. We also have gluten free wafers and pre-filled cups of white grape juice for those who request/require them. Those who are not comfortable sharing in Holy Communion in this fashion are still in full Communion through the words of promise.

You are encouraged to share the "Peace of God" in whatever way you feel comfortable.

Both Services are in the Sanctuary with coffee and refreshments available in the CLC before and after each service.

Masks are no longer required for anyone, but you are encouraged to wear a mask if you are more comfortable doing so. Masks are available at the Greeter's Desk.

Hand sanitizer – available throughout the building.

We are live streaming the 10:30 Worship Service. This service is then uploaded to our website to be viewed later. The live stream is available through our website and YouTube page.

We are still looking for a couple folks who would be willing to help with live streaming from time to time.

Please join us only if you feel safe and comfortable doing so. If you are not feeling well or test positive for Covid 19, please stay home.

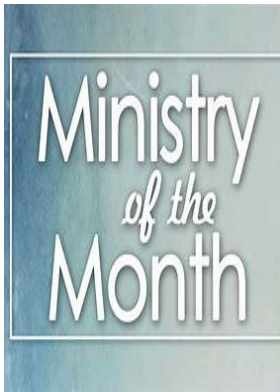
You may also sponsor Communion Elements for a particular Sunday in the same manner. The donation for sponsoring elements is \$20. Please contact the church office if you have any questions.

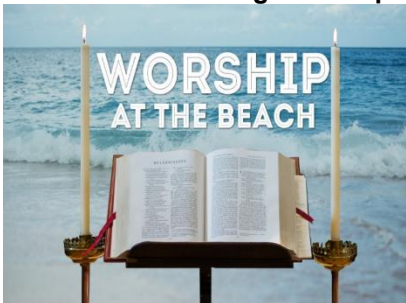
