++Pastor's Letter to the Congregation++

Grace, mercy, and peace to you from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ.

"I thank my God every time I remember you in all my prayers for all of you I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now." Philipians 1: 2-3

Letter writing has become a lost art. St. Paul was the master of the rhetorical style of writing to impart guidance, correction of thought and action and most importantly, the love of God in Christ Jesus to his friends through out the known world in his time. We have email and texting which are of questionable strength and intensity when true emotions are meant to be shared. This is simply the way of the world. In ancient times Paul knew that his letters would be read to the masses for their edification, not just as updates. Paul knew that a "thank you in the name of Jesus" carried a lot of weight in the growing communities of the church. So, here is my "thank you" letter to you, my fellow workers in the vineyard we call St. Peter's.

Every Sunday I am thankful for your presence and participation in worship, for bringing your friends to church to hear the Word of God. During the week I give thanks to God and offer you encouragement to continue the greater work of the community in our Open Door feeding program and our Son and Sand Retreat Center and winter Shelter program. "Finally, brothers and sisters, whatever is true, whatever is noble, whatever is right, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is admirable – if anything is excellent or praiseworthy – think about such things.....put it into practice. And the God of peace will be with you!" Philipians 4: 8-9

A MESSAGE FROM THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT

God's Peace and Blessings to the Congregation of St. Peter's Lutheran Church,

May is the time of year when we see increased traffic within the town of Ocean City. This is also the time we see increased visitors at St. Peter's Lutheran Church. If you see a visitor at the church, please take time to welcome and thank them for attending service at St. Peter's. Your kindness will go a long way toward having them visit again.

Spring is in full swing, and May is the month to pamper our mothers. Happy Mother's Day to all of the moms in our congregation.

Flowers are in bloom and so is St. Peter's Lutheran Church. Our congregation is growing, and we continue to welcome new members. If you have a friend(s) looking for a church home, ask them to visit St. Peter's and take-in our Contemporary or Traditional services.

I want to provide the congregation with an overview of the Call Process as we will be moving forward with the process. Our Call Committee will be meeting on May 6th to complete the Ministry Site Profile (MSP). The Call Committee will present the MSP to the Church Council at its May 12, 2026, meeting. Once the Church Council reviews jointly with the Call Committee, the Call Committee will submit the final/completed MSP to

the Synod to be reviewed by the bishop's staff. Our MSP will then be stored within the ELCA's Mobility Database. Ministry Opportunities will make it possible for rostered ministers and others to search the database of MSP's to learn of ministry openings and to read a basic snapshot of information about each opening, including St. Peter's. Candidates who are interested in St. Peter's must be in good standing. The bishops and their assistant will review candidates who express interest in St. Peter's and will provide names to the Call Committee for review. The Call Committee will review the Rostered Minister Profiles and determine if they are interested in interviewing candidates that are deemed the best fit for St. Peter's. Interviews are conducted, and when the Call Committee determines they have found a "Primary Candidate," they notify the Bishop's Office and the Church Council. The Call Committee must have 100% consensus of the candidate. If one Call Committee member is not interested in the candidate, the candidate will not be considered a "Primary Candidate" and the process of searching for a candidate continues. Once the Call Committee selects the "Primary Candidate," there are still steps that must be taken. The candidate must be advised that they are our "Primary Candidate." If the Pastor agrees to be the "Primary Candidate," a joint meeting will be scheduled with the Call Committee, Church Council, and candidate. A discussion with the "Primary Candidate" is carried out to its conclusion. There are two (2) outcomes to the discussion. It is determined that the discussion leads to the conclusion that this person IS NOT the one whom the Holy Spirit is leading to be called by this congregation, or the discussion leads to the conclusion that this person IS the one whom the Spirit is leading to be called by the congregation. If the person IS the one, a council vote is taken; and, if at least $\frac{3}{4}$ agree to recommend the candidate to the congregation, the Call Committee chairperson contacts the Assistant to the Bishop. A Special Congregation Meeting, as outlined in our Constitution, will be scheduled. The candidate will preside and preach at the Worship Service prior to the meeting. Immediately after the service, the Council President will call the meeting to order, confirm a quorum, state the purpose of the meeting, read

the council's recommendation to call the pastor, state the congregation's eligibility requirements for voting, and turn the meeting over to the Synod's representative. The Synod representative will read the call with all pertinent data, including a compensation and benefits package. Members will be given an opportunity to ask questions. A printed ballot will then be provided to congregation members. Tellers will distribute, collect, and count the ballots. Once the vote is tabulated, the congregation will be advised immediately. Absentee ballots are not permitted. Approval of the candidate to be called must meet 2/3 majority of the votes cast by the congregation in attendance.

I am providing this overview to get everyone prepared for the process. Once we submit the MSP, our Call Committee will be receiving information on Rostered Ministers who may be interested in St. Peter's. This process may move swiftly or at a snail's pace. Please be patient, and please pray for our Call Committee as they move forward with this process to select our Called Pastor. More information will follow.

ALTAR FLOWERS & COMMUNION ELEMENTS

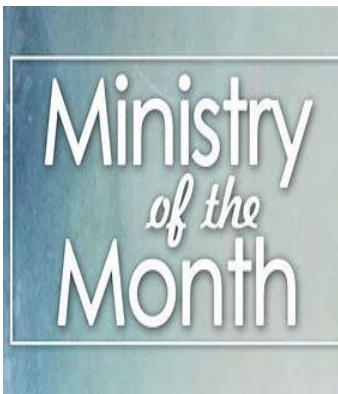
